CLUB OFFICER TRAINING

A big thank you to the Division Directors and presenters for their dedication, and time given, to holding fourteen Club Officer Training sessions and two Corporate Focused Leadership Training sessions. We are still finalising numbers, but as things stand 76% of clubs had four or more officers attend Club Officer Training. Thirteen clubs, however, had no club officers attend training. We will be in contact with these clubs to confirm each club officer is comfortable with their role and is aware of the full extent of the opportunities and responsibilities their role entails. Our goal for this year is to ensure each club officer is empowered to perform their role and is having their voice heard at executive meetings.

As of the 25th of July, only **56.40%** of new members had enrolled in Pathways. This figure is skewed to some extent by a new club in Division O, whose founder moved to a different geographical region, resulting in the cub being rebuilt.

Even if you are still working in the **Traditional Programme**, we encourage all members to enrol in **Pathways** and at least complete their **Ice Breaker** and preferably the whole of **Level 1**. Clubs really need the depth of knowledge and skills of our experienced Toastmasters. By enrolling in Pathways all members have access to the Pathways evaluation sheets. By completing Level One, members have an understanding as to how Pathways approaches evaluations. Particularly from Level 3 onwards, many of the projects have similarities to the traditional programme projects. We need our experienced Toastmasters knowledge to enable members to gain optimum benefit from the projects they are completing in Pathways.

At present **not all Club Officers** are **enrolled in Pathways**. As at the **25th of July**, **84.17%** of our **Club Officers** were Pathways enrolled. We are aware that number has subsequently increased. We will be contacting any **Club Officers** who are not enrolled to see how we may support them in choosing a Path and starting in Pathways.

We are looking to the below statistics improving and are **striving to have 100% of members enrolled in Pathways** by the end of the year.

We are delighted that you now have access to **all projects at all levels** within your Path. This means that you may choose to complete the project that suits you best at the time. In order to gain credit for your level you will still need to complete the required projects per level, but you may choose in which order you complete your projects.

Please remember that when you complete a Level in Pathways, this needs to be signed off **both** in Pathways Base Camp **and** registered as an award in Club Central on the Toastmasters International website. If you are a member of more than one club, remember to advise your Base Camp Manager if you intend to give your award to another one of your clubs. Base Camp Managers, please also be mindful of this possibility when registering dual member's awards.

I am sure by now our Base Camp Managers have seen the revised Member Progress Report for Base Camp managers. AREA CONTESTS AND CHANGES TO THE SPEECH CONTEST RULEBOOK

We are looking forward to seeing the results of our Area Contests. Attending a judging workshop is a great way to not only improve your own speaking, but also is an excellent networking opportunity to find judges for your contests.

District will be providing all the Documentation for the Area and Division Contests.

We are delighted that Toastmasters International took cognisance of their members concerns and have changed Rule 5.A.2 under General Procedures on page 9 of the rulebook. Please note this change, as this change has been made subsequent to Club Officer Training. When referring to the Speech Contest Rulebook 2019/2020, please ensure you are using Version 8/2019. This rule pertains to the number of required judges at Area Level and states:

"At area contests, there must be an equal number of voting judges from each club in the area, **or** a minimum of five voting judges. In addition to these voting judges, a contest chair, chief judge, tiebreaking judge, two counters, and two timers must be appointed." 8/2019

DISTRICT INCENTIVES

In addition to the incentives arranged by Division and Area Directors and in addition to the **incentives** mentioned earlier re **Club Officer Training**, the District is offering two main incentives:

- Clubs will receive a \$30 Toastmasters International shop credit, or credit towards a flag, or other approved item of their choice, where they have:
 - 100% of members who have been a member for more than two months, are enrolled in Pathways and have completed their Ice Breaker by December 2019
 - 100% of members who have been a member for more than two months, are enrolled in Pathways and completed their Ice Breaker by May 2020
 - 75% of members, who have been a member for more than four months and have completed their Level 1 by 30 June 2020.
 - Members who complete their Level One within four months of joining Toastmasters will be recognised
- Clubs who have
 - Completed their **Club Success Plan**, as per the Club Officer Training workbook
 - Had their **plan signed** by all Club Officers
 - Handed in their Club Success Plan to their Area or Division Director, or member of the Trio by 1st November 2019, will receive a credit towards a flag, billboard, Toastmaster tablecloth or Toastmasters International store credit.
