Division Events and other newsworthy items

There were 2 Division K Club Officer Training sessions for Round 1, these were held on the 27th of July in Kerikeri and the 31st of August in Albany. Overall a total of 89 club officers from Division K were trained which is approximately 61% of our officers. This is a great starting point for us to improve upon.

The Area K1 Judging Workshop held on the 21st of September in Kaitaia, hosted by On Top Toastmasters, was a great success with over 20 attendees (combined Toastmasters and community members).
