Performance

The performance of our District in the first three months of the year is very pleasing. Club payments to 30 September was 2259 which places us 10th in the world and 5th in the region. This is an amazing result. Our District currently has 160 Clubs and that places us 41st in the world and 2nd in the region. Our District ranks 55th in the world for clubs with 20+ members, and ranks 43rd in the world for net club growth. Toastmasters International has 125 districts around the world and this places our District in the top half of the table.

We continue to grow and recently we welcomed our newest club to the fold - "**Countdown to Speech Master**". Please join me in warmly welcoming our newest club. Countdown to Speech Master club is currently allocated to Division O.

Achievements

Worthy achievements for the District include five Pathways Advanced Mentors and 22 Triple Crown Awards. I am pleased to say that eight of the recipients of the Triple Crown award are District Officers. I would like to challenge the Division Directors to get as many Division and Area Directors achieving this award.

Appointments

I am delighted to announce the appointment of Sharon Kerr-Phillips as the District Leadership Committee Chairman. I am also delighted to announce the official appointment of the Audit Committee of Jilnaught Wong (Chairman), Andrew Eberhard and Maris Dunn. There have been no new area or division directors appointed since the last DEC meeting, which is a good position for the District to be in.

Town Hall session

As part of our continued transparency policy, our second Townhall session takes place on Friday 12 November and I look forward to seeing many of our club members there. We will provide an update on district activities and answer all questions directed to the trio.
