District Officer Training and Executive Meeting – 9th July 2022

We held our first hybrid training and executive at Manukau Baptist Church in Auckland and on zoom.

District Director, Wendy Wickliffe, presented her theme for this year of "Reconnect, Rebuild and Retain".

The following are examples of some of the actions that will be implemented for the year:

- Create a club support team to provide individualised support based on club needs
- Send an email to each new member from 1 July, information specific to our district and information to start their journey to achieve a level one in pathways
- Monthly new member induction pathway workshop on getting started in pathways. Vice President of Education can continue to do at their clubs, or they may want to send their new members to the monthly online meeting (details to come)
- Micro learning short videos or useful links that can be reviewed in five to ten minutes.

Triple Crown

The Triple Crown award is a pin you may wear with pride, which proves you have completed any 3 levels in Pathways in a 12-month period. As Triple Crowns are earnt this year, we will email the recipient and ask when you would like to receive your pin. Options are sent to the club president to present at the club (photo required) or can be presented at the division conferences in October or March.

DTM Awards

The Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM) award represents the highest level of educational achievement in Toastmasters. To earn the DTM, you are required to:

Complete two learning paths

- Serve as a club officer for 12 months, participate in the preparation of a Club Success Plan, and participate in a district-sponsored club officer training program.
- Serve a complete one-year term as a district officer.
- Serve successfully as a club mentor or coach.
- Serve successfully as a club sponsor or conduct a Speechcraft or Youth Leadership program.
- Complete the DTM project.(Members are required to create and implement a project of their own design, in which they demonstrate the skills and expertise they have gained.)

For the 2021-to-2022-year congratulations to District Director, Wendy Wickliffe and Immediate Past President, Stephen Budai on achieving their DTMs. Two is a small number for the size of our district, let's aim for a minimum of 6 more this year.
