Club Coaches - what clubs have a coach appointed, and what clubs still need a coach appointed?

It looks like Staci Marris will bid to become a coach for Onehunga. James Edley has expressed an interest in coaching M.A.R.C. The club has yet to approve James, however alternatively Ernst and Young will happily take him.

Club Support – what clubs would benefit from additional support, and what support is required?

At the handover meeting seven clubs were identified as being ones that needed additional information and support. They appear on the first page being those clubs with 10 members or less. It was resolved to keep an eye on them and make sure that regular area council meetings are held and they participate in the same. In the absence of an Area Director for M5 we have agreed to share the responsibility for club visits and co opt a past Area Director to help in the meantime.

### **New Clubs – Prospects, leads, clubs in formation**

What is the progress, and what support is needed?

No new clubs were formed in the division last year and it is unlikely any will charter this coming Toastmasters year. If however none of the current clubs fall over it will be an improvement on the 2021/22 and 2022/23™ years. Subject to approval on June 24, agreement has been reached to the realign clubs into closer geographic areas and to align the corporate clubs together.
