In general Division K clubs are progressing well with their contests in preparation for the area contests:

Area K3: Thursday, 14th September, 2023

K4 Area Director Kenneth Gustilo has stepped down as AD to focus on her new role as District Public Relations Manager. Helen Madden from East Coast Bays Toastmasters has agreed to take up the AD K4 role.

All my AD's have had at least one Area Council meeting, and I've had the pleasure to attend. All were well run and very informative.

I am a little worried about the Club Officer Training results. Some of the items in the register still look incorrect, and there are a number of clubs with low counts. I'll ask the AD's to follow up with their clubs.

Area 1 - Gavin Lamb

The biggest challenge is the distance between clubs, but they have been encouraged by the decision to allow hybrid contests. At least two of the clubs have held a successful combined hybrid club contest.

Area 3 - Murray Coutts

Area 3 is on track, Murray has a huge amount of Toastmasters knowledge so was able to start early. A couple of his clubs are low in numbers, and Hibiscus Coast in particular could do with a coach.

Area 4 - Helen Madden

Helen accepted the AD role on 25th August so is starting her handover from Kenneth.

Three of the five clubs have completed their club contests, the remaining two to have a combined contest on Thursday 31st August.

Academic Toastmasters is currently at 31 members which looks exciting, but they are expecting to lose 10 members at the September renewal time. This is simply because of the nature of a University club, where graduating students leave the club.
