## Support

Club Coaches - what clubs have a coach appointed, and what clubs still need a coach appointed?

Staci Marris while yet to be appointed formally is acting as a club coach for Onehunga. We have 6 clubs eligible for a club coach.

Club Support – what clubs would benefit from additional support, and what support is required?

The clubs in Areas M1 and M4 (Corporate clubs) are getting strong support from their Area Director. Area M2 Director continues to be a struggle, she is continuing to undertake her role although is struggling with the commitments it brings and requires plenty of support. Now that the first round of competitions is over, Club visits are the focus. The membership base has dropped in three of Area 1,2 and Area 3 clubs, and in two of Area 4 and Area 5 clubs. Only one club in Area 2 has shown significant growth with 5 new members the balance of clubs have remained virtually unchanged.

Pathways support is still variable, the announced upgrades, when they happen will help to alleviate this issue for next year. In the meantime, we will continue to push for its use as it is today. Further training and getting new members enrolled quickly will be important for non-corporate clubs. The corporate clubs are a harder problem. 2 degrees has been suspended and will be closed.

**New Clubs – Prospects, leads, clubs in formation** What is the progress, and what support is needed?

WNZL was identified as wanting a second club, the enrolled membership has dropped significantly, the Area Director is visiting the club this week.

## **Division Events**

What events have been held, and what feedback have you received? For example – COT, Area or Division council meetings, Area or Division contests, workshops etc

Division M has had two Division Council meetings in September and two October related to the Area contests covering planning and then a post competition review. There were also 4 Division M and N combined District Council meeting for the combined Division M and N conference on October 28. The two Divisions have been working well together, Division M undertook the major roles for these two competitions. Division N will do the same in the next competitions. In the conference two educational sessions were undertaken, one on evaluation and the other on lessons learnt from losing, presented by Giyora Barzilay. This presentation has been used at other Division conferences and is worth listening to.

Three Kings and Flying Start have both met the 5 DCP goal target by December. Morning Toast, Maungakiekie and Auckland Toastmasters all have 4 DCP goals achieved to date.
