Club Support – what clubs would benefit from additional support, and what support is required?

Both Division Conferences are complete, and the second round of club visits are underway.

**Area 1** - Gavin Lamb

On Top has closed, and one member has transferred to Bay of Islands. They gave it a good shot over the last year by partnering up with Bay of Islands to help generate interest, but ultimately it was too much work for the few remaining people to run it. They haven't officially closed, with the hope that it'll be able to be relaunched in 6 months.

The other clubs in Area 1 are strong, including Bay of Islands that is lower on members.

**Area 3** - Murray Coutts

Owera Lunchtime has closed and some members have transferred to other clubs. This club has also tried several strategies over the last few years to encourage growth, but was ultimately unsuccessful and decided it was too difficult to continue.

Riverhead and Hibiscus Coast could do with some additional support, such as a club coach. In the meantime Murray is successfully supporting them and encouraging them to request a coach.

Hibiscus Coast is very close to achieving Distinguished status.

**Area 4** - Helen Madden

This is generally a very strong area and most of the clubs have achieved their DCP goals. Sunnynook, while energetic, are still struggling. They have a club coach, and have started visiting other clubs to learn new ideas to bring back to their home club. It is unlikely they'll achieve distinguished status this year, but they are setting themselves up well to achieve it next year.

Both Academic and Kristin are close to achieving Distinguished states. Given the nature of Academic with it being a University club, I expect they'll find their members. Kristin will have a harder job.

I want to give a huge shout out to the three Area Directors in Division K - they have been outstanding.
