**General comments**

1. This is my last report of the year. I have simplified from my previous report so I encourage people to read the previous report where I categorised different clubs into areas that I thought worthy of highlighting. It is also a short timeframe since the previous report so few new items to report. Again, please refer to the previous report.



2. Only 4 clubs in Division N have reached Distinguished status. 4 further clubs would have reached this achievement with the goals that they have achieved; however have not had the member growth required by Toastmasters International to recognise the DCP goals achievement.
3. The required number of Area Director Club Reports were completed on time.
4. The Division clubs will be realigned into different Areas from 1 July 2024.

## **Support**

Refer to the previous report for specific details – unchanged since then. However below are general comments:

- Work is needed to see what can be done about reestablishing a strong Auckland University club.
- There are a number of clubs that still require active encouragement to adopt Pathways for all members – Moo Talk and Waitemata are 2 examples. Encouragement is needed
- There are a number of clubs that, whilst adopting Pathways, are not actively recording in Club Central nor following other generic Toastmasters requirement (eg Club officer training) – Early Birds and ANZ are 2 examples. Encouragement is needed
- Very few Division N clubs hold club contests or nominate participants to Area Contests. Encouragement is suggested
- One club – Moo Talk, has avoided all contact with Division Officers this year. This will require some diligence!
